Statistical Data Report for January 2026, Released April 2026

State Employment and Unemployment

Unemployment rates were higher in January in 1 state and stable in 49 states and the District of Columbia, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported. Fourteen states and the District of Columbia had unemployment rate increases from January 2025, the largest of which was in Delaware (+1.3 percentage points). The only over-the-year rate decreases occurred in Indiana and Ohio (-0.5 percentage point each). Thirty-four states had jobless rates that were not notably different from those of a year earlier, though some had changes that were at least as large numerically as the significant changes. The national unemployment rate, 4.3 percent, changed little over the month but was 0.3 percentage point higher than in January 2025.

In January 2026, nonfarm payroll employment increased in 5 states, decreased in the District of Columbia, and was essentially unchanged in 45 states. Employment increased in California (+93,500, or +0.5 percent), Texas (+40,100, or +0.3 percent), Illinois (+18,000, or +0.3 percent), Indiana (+11,200, or +0.3 percent), and Iowa (+6,400, or +0.4 percent). Employment decreased in the District (-5,400, or -0.7 percent). Over the year, nonfarm payroll employment increased in 4 states, decreased in Maryland and the District, and was essentially unchanged in 45 states.

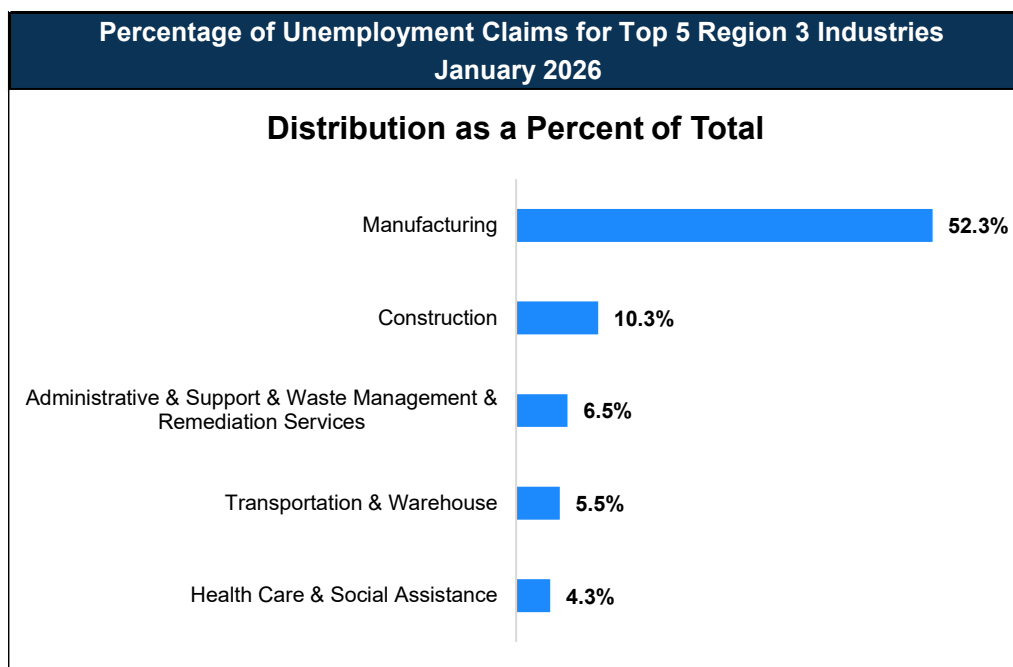

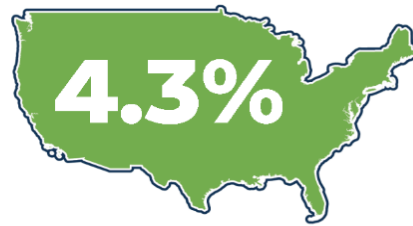

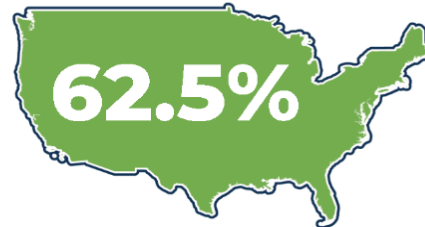

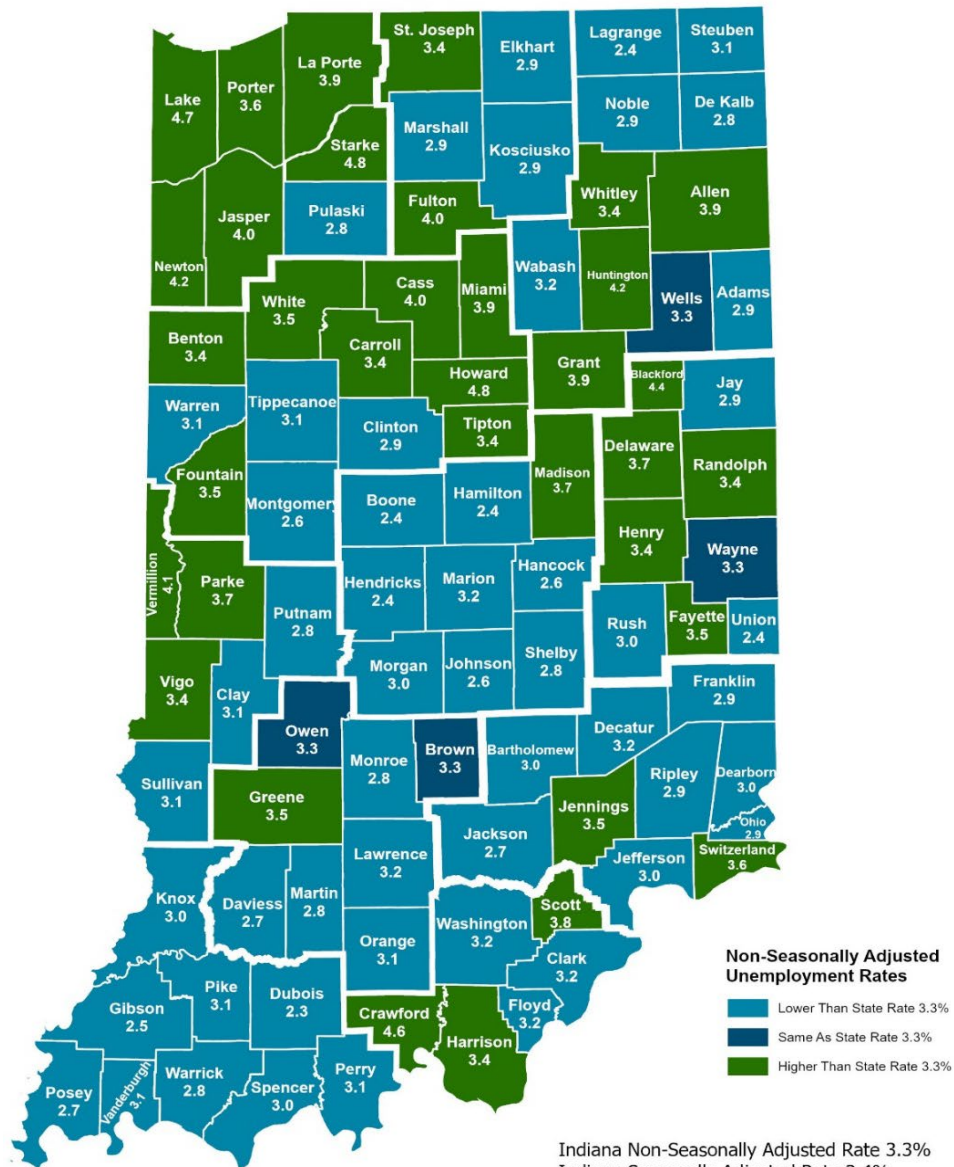
